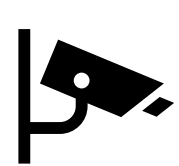

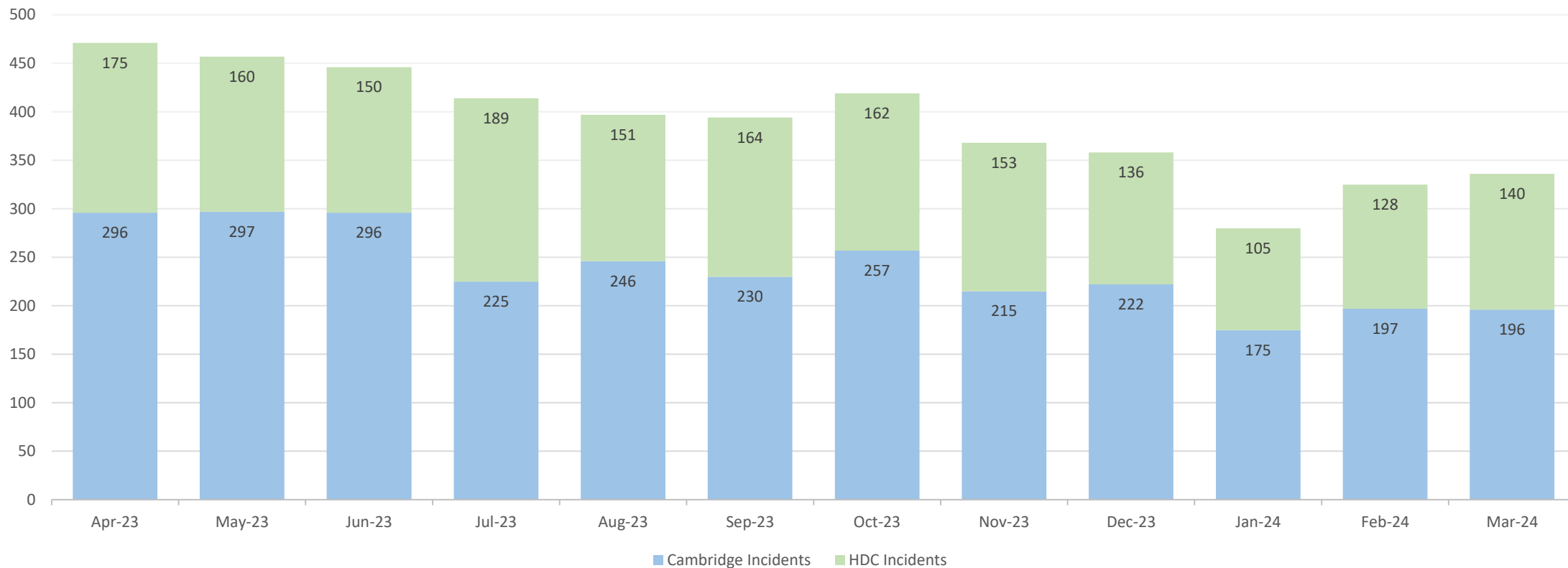

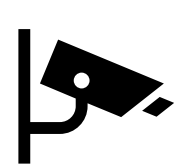


# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024



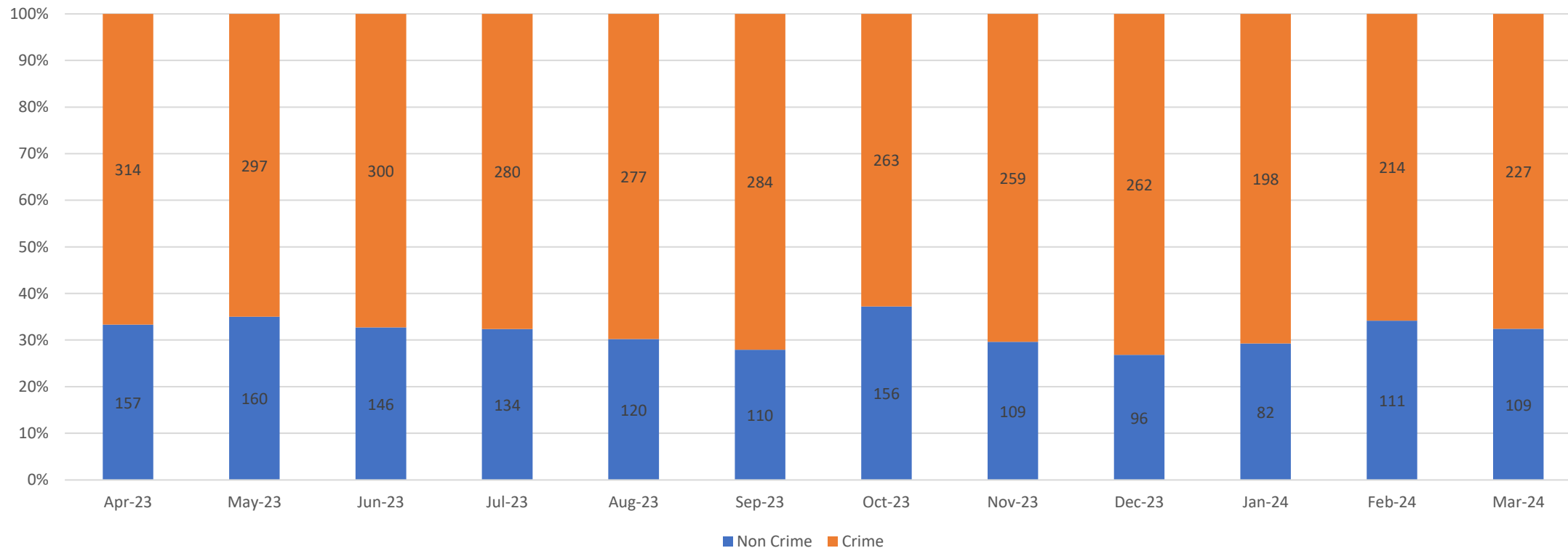
This chart shows the total number of CCTV incidents split by HDC and Cambridge City Council from April 2023 through to March 2024.

# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS: CRIME VS NON-CRIME % SPLIT

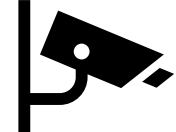

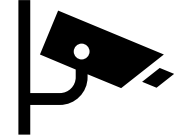

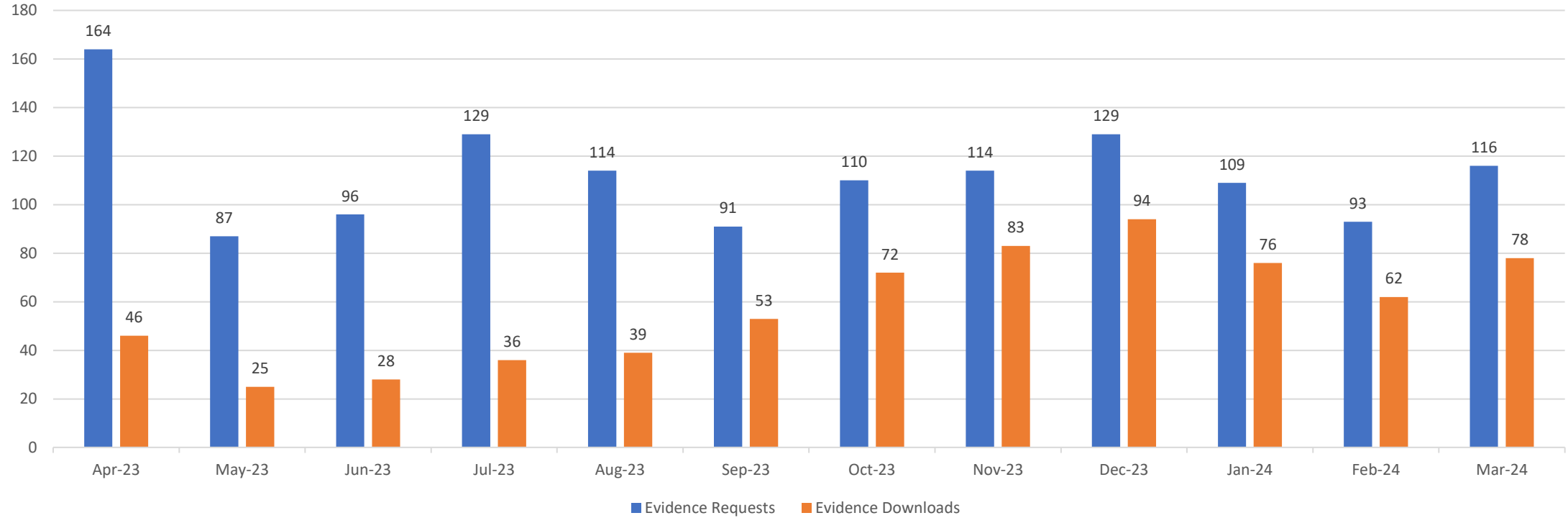

# TOTAL CCTV EVIDENCE REQUEST & DOWNLOADS APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024



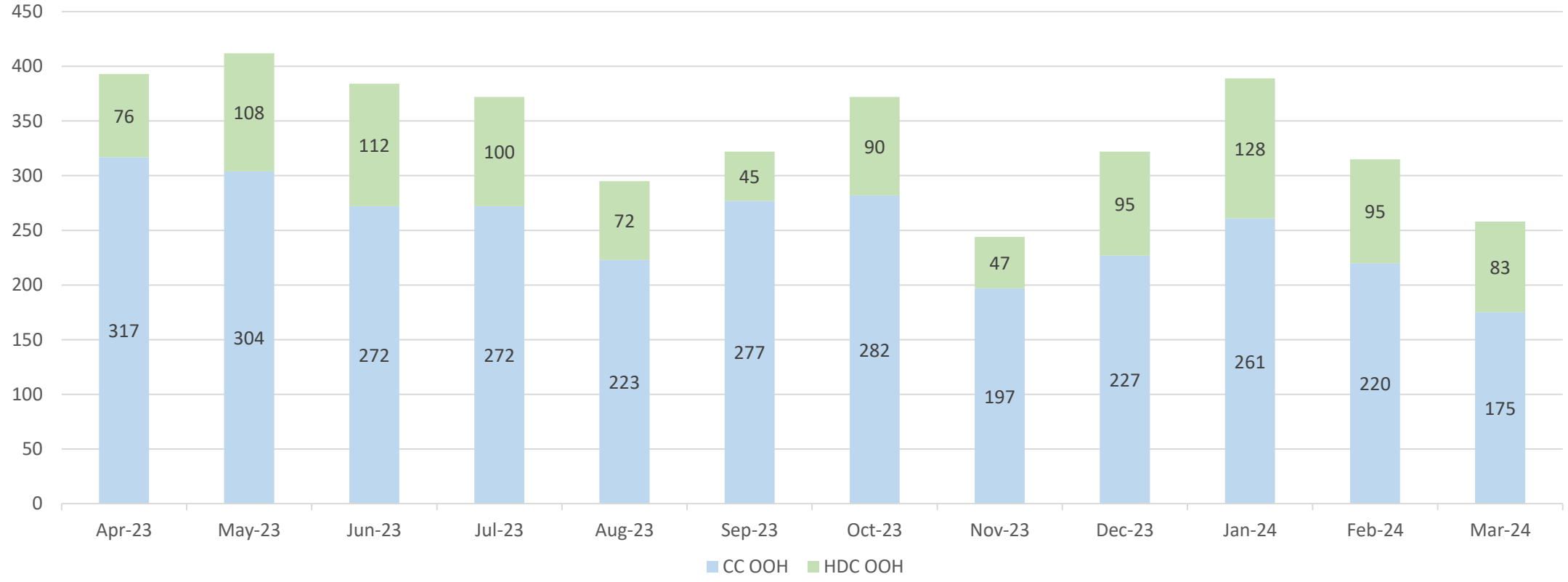
This chart shows the number of evidence requests and over the last year.

# TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALLS RECEIVED APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024

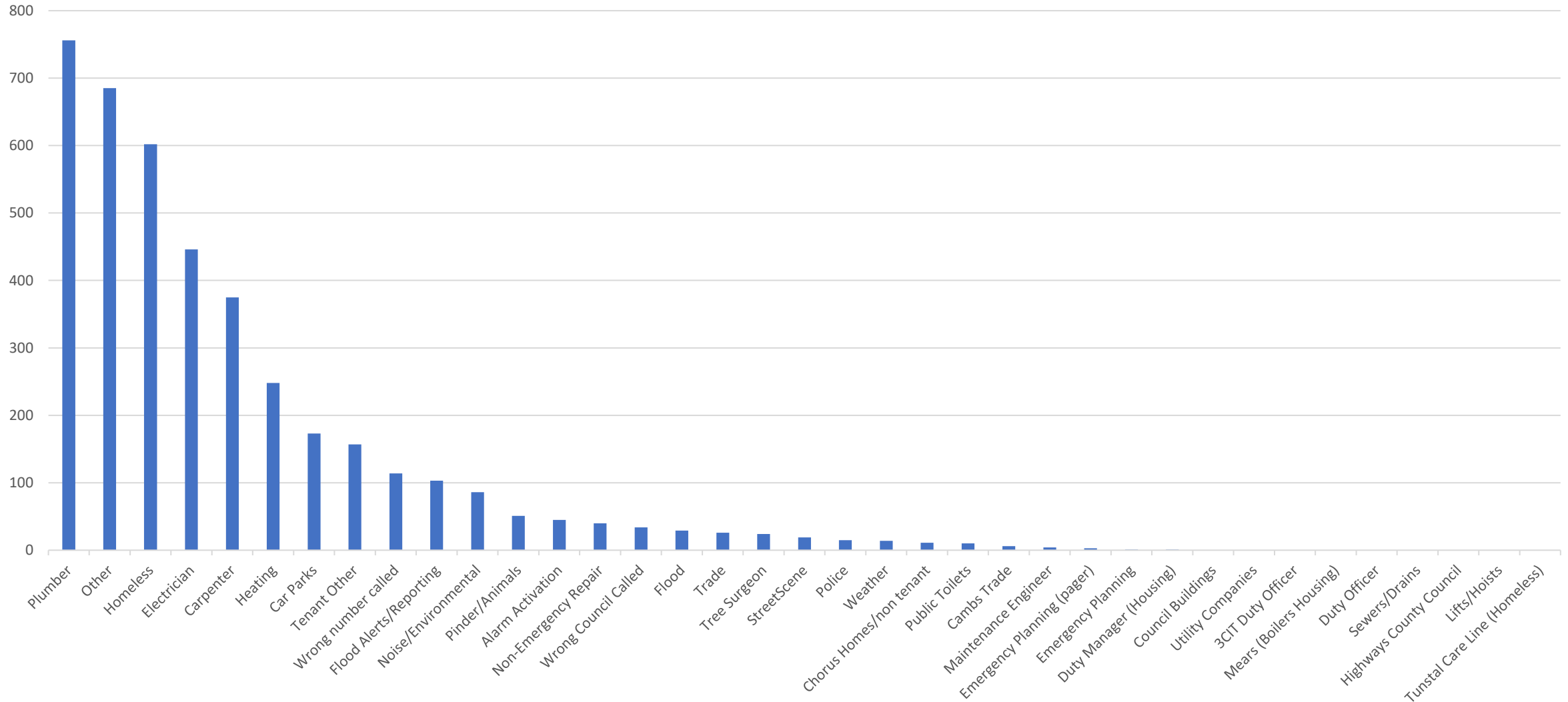


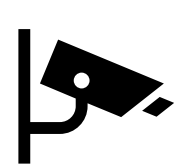

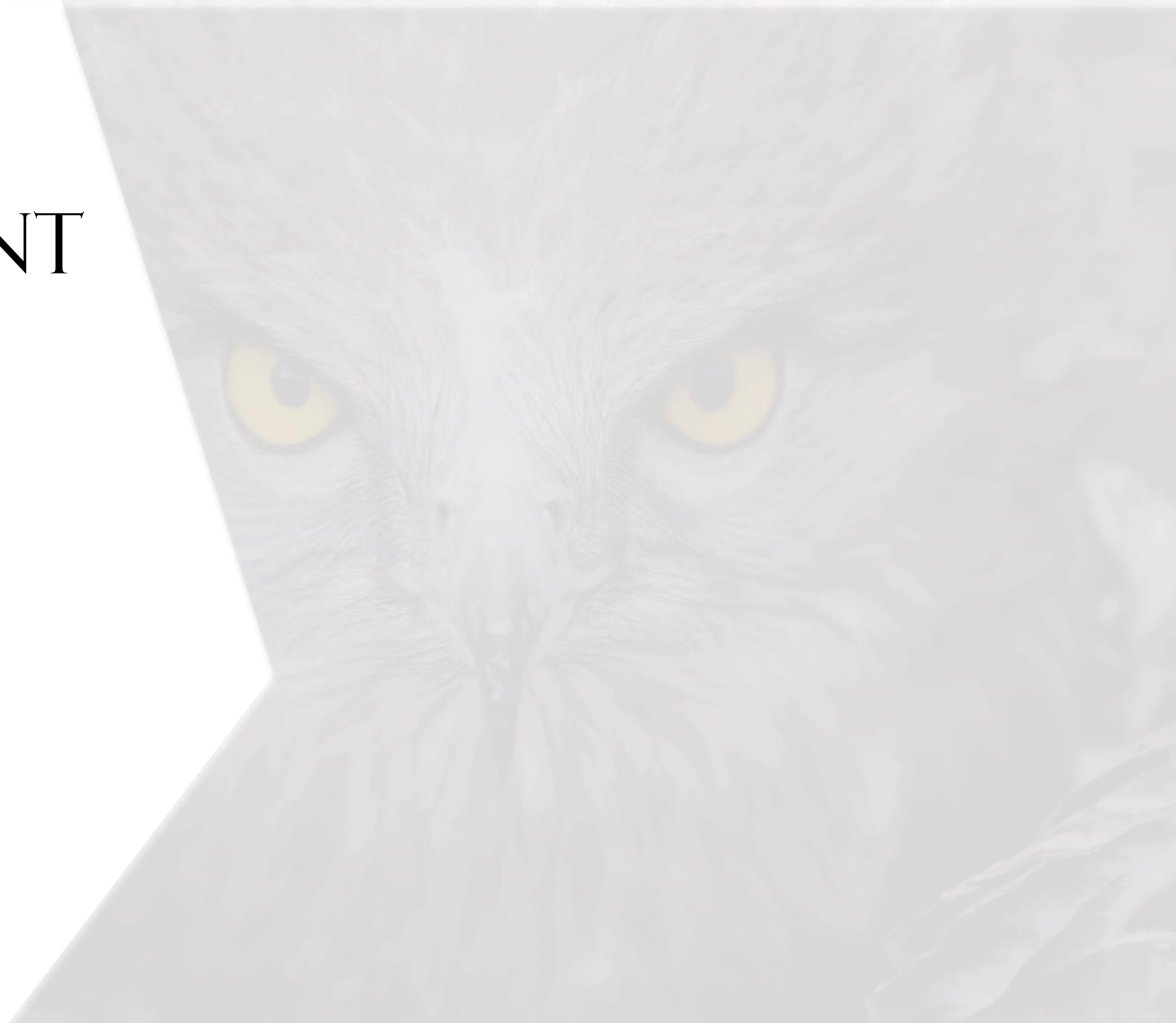
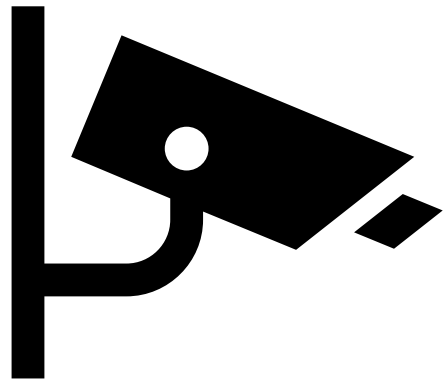
# TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024



# CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results, we would like to share several highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.





# RE-ACTIVE ARREST – SHOPLIFTING – CAMBRIDGE



Incident 17835– 11<sup>th</sup> April 2023 – AW, RL

## **KNOWN THIEF ARRESTED**

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, a city centre retailer was reporting a suspect who had attempted to shoplift from their premises. His description was taken and cameras were deployed.

The suspect was soon spotted walking away from the shops, he briefly went off camera. When he reappeared he had changed his clothing and was then heading back towards the shops, cameras were used to track him again. He is seen entering a building close to the market square, when he comes out he has changed his clothes again. Police advise the operators of the incident number and deploy officers, it seems that the male was already wanted for 4 other thefts.

Police arrive at the suspects location, he runs from them and officers chase. Operators help police by updating them of his location until he is finally surrounded and gives up. He is arrested and taken away.



Incident 17970 – 18<sup>th</sup> April 2023 – RS, MH

### **TOWN CENTRE ROBBERY CAUGHT ON CAMERA**

Operators spotted a robbery taking place in the town centre, it appeared to be 3 males trying to rob another male. Cameras were deployed and police were informed over the airwaves, officers were on route.

One of the suspects is seen punching the victim, who is wearing a school uniform. Thankfully, officers arrived on scene and immediately arrested 2 of the suspects, unfortunately the third suspect managed to evade officers and left the scene on his bicycle. Cameras were used to track the third suspect across the town, officers were directed to his location and he was eventually found and arrested.



# RE-ACTIVE ARREST – OFFENSIVE WEAPON – CAMBRIDGE



Incident 19141 - 24<sup>th</sup> June 2023 – PM, RL

## **ARREST FOR POSSESSION OF KITCHEN KNIFE**

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, it was a city centre night club reporting 2 males waving long kitchen knives around. Cameras were deployed and police were informed of their location.

The 2 males were seen getting on bikes and riding away from the location, the details were passed to police and observations were maintained. Police arrived and managed to arrest one of the suspects, unfortunately the second male managed to ride away on his bike. After a short chase, the second male was caught by police and arrested.



# REACTIVE INCIDENT – CONCERN FOR PERSON - HUNTINGDON



Incident 19854 – 1<sup>st</sup> August 2023 – EF-F, LM

## Concern for child

Operators received a call via the HBAC radio, concerns had been raised for a young child whose mother appeared to be highly intoxicated. A description was taken, and the cameras were deployed.

The pair were spotted in the town centre, operators confirmed that the mother did appear to be extremely intoxicated. Police were called and observations were maintained as the mother and daughter moved around the town. They were seen crossing a road, the mother not holding the child's hand and operators witnessed a near miss as the child ran out into the road and in front of a car.

Police arrived and took control of the situation, looking after the child and speaking to the mother, who was later arrested as her alcohol levels were confirmed to be very high.

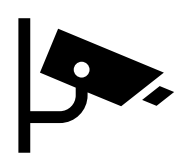

## **PICKPOCKET SPOTTED IN CITY CENTRE**

A male was spotted approaching a couple in the city centre, he was acting suspiciously. The male was seen hugging the victims, then taking a mobile phone from one of their pockets. He was then trying to open the other victims handbag.

The description and location of the suspect was given to the police over the radio, fortunately officers were nearby and were on scene within a few minutes. Operators observed the suspect moving between groups of people, trying to steal items from pockets and bags, when officers stopped and searched him they found the stolen phone and placed him under arrest.

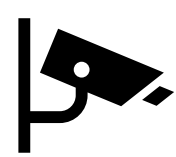

## **THEFT SPOTTED ON CAMERA**

Operators spotted what appeared to be sparks behind some trees in the city centre, they moved the camera to get a better view and could see a white van backed up to a parked lorry. There was a male with his face covered taking boxes off the lorry and passing them to another male who was loading them into the van.

Police were informed of this over the airwaves and officers were deployed. When officers caught up with the vehicle they arrested the driver, it was confirmed that the van was using false plates and had been stolen from Leeds.



# REACTIVE ARREST – THEFT – HUNTINGDON

Incident 22186 – 14<sup>th</sup> December 2023 – RL, LM, MH



## **KNOWN MALE ARRESTED FOR SHOPLIFTING**

Operators received a call from the town ranger, reporting a known offender riding his bike through the town centre. Cameras were deployed and operators quickly spotted the known male.

He was seen entering 2 premises, leaving each location with stolen goods. This was reported to police over the radio and observations were maintained.

Police arrived on scene and arrested the male for theft, he was detained and taken away.

Incident 22509 – 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2024 – LM, RL

## **CONCERN FOR PERSON ON BRIDGE**

Operators spotted a male on top of a bridge in the city, he was kneeling on the arm rail looking over the edge at the road. Concerned for his welfare, the incident was called through the police via the radio, observations were maintained.

Police arrived at the scene, they confirmed that he was a missing person they were looking for. Officers carefully approached the male from both ends of the bridge, they detained him before he was able to cause himself any harm.

This was a fantastic example of how important our operators are, they prevented a potentially tragic incident and aided the police in finding a missing person.



# REACTIVE INCIDENT – FAIL TO STOP – CAMBRIDGE

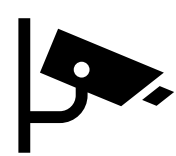


## **FAIL TO STOP CAUGHT ON CAMERA**

A call was received via the police radio, an officer had just come across a male lying in the road in the city centre. The officer was asking if cameras had spotted the vehicle which had hit the male, who was breathing but injured and in need of hospital treatment.

Operators reviewed camera footage and found one of the cameras was pointing directly at the incident location, although it was from some distance away. Using playback, they were able to see the incident and follow the vehicle involved, they used another camera to confirm the vehicle index number and relayed this information to police.





# PROACTIVE ARREST - DRUGS – CAMBRIDGE



Incident 23691 – 21<sup>st</sup> March 2024 – RS, LM, EF-F

## **DRUG DEALER ARRESTED**

Operators spotted a male running towards a city centre restaurant looking angry, they deployed cameras to the location. He was seen with another male, who threw a punch at him before they both entered the premises. A call via the CAMBAC radio was made, to check what was happening inside the premises, just as the pair were seen leaving and then making their way across the city centre. The pair are joined by two other males and the fight is separated; the group is followed on camera and another male joins them.

It is then that operators observed the group exchanging money for what is potentially drugs, it is called through to the police and observations are maintained. The group disperse, operators maintain a visual on the male who is suspected of dealing drugs. Police arrive on scene and detain the male, carry out a stop search and arrest him after finding class A and B drugs on his possession.

## **MISSING PERSON FOUND**

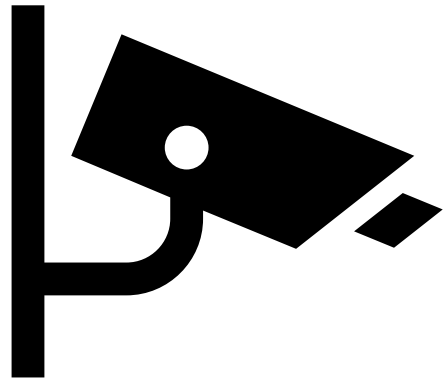
A request was received from police, asking to look for a high-risk missing person who was reported to be in the St Ives area. Shortly after the police request, a call was received via the HBAC radio, a town centre pub had spotted the male on the market square.

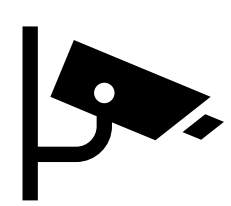
Cameras were deployed and the male was found, operators notified the police and shared the live footage. The male was observed walking around the town centre until he went off camera, believed to have entered the library, officers arrived and located the male

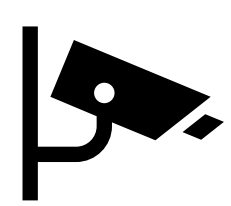

## Cambridge thief sent to prison

A man who stole goods from shops across Cambridge has been sent to prison. Jamie Williams, 27, of Sackville Close, Cambridge, was arrested by police on Tuesday after he was identified on CCTV images as being responsible for a number of thefts in the city.

Between 9 December and 2 January, Williams stole coffee, chocolate, laundry products, meat and cheese worth more than £500 from Co-Ops in Chesterton Road, Milton Road and Cambridge Square as well as perfume from TK Maxx in Sidney Street.

At Cambridge Magistrates' Court yesterday, (10 January), Williams pleaded guilty to six counts of theft and was sentenced to 28 weeks in prison. He must also pay £500 in compensation.

PC Alex Thake, who investigated, said: "Shoplifting can have a huge impact on both businesses and those who work for them and often comes hand in hand with other crimes. We're committed to working alongside businesses that are victims of theft to catch those responsible and put them before the courts."

## Bike thief jailed

A Cambridge bike thief has been jailed for six months. James Peyton, of no fixed address, was handed the sentence at Cambridge Magistrate's Court yesterday (16 May).

The 29-year-old admitted stealing five bikes and one e-scooter between 12 December last year (2022) and 21 March from Grand Arcade cycle park, St Andrews Street and Cambridge Station Cycle Park.

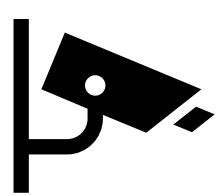
He also admitted one count of theft by finding. A further seven offences of bike theft were taken into consideration by the magistrate upon sentencing after being admitted by Peyton.

PC Rob Tindall, from the Cambridge City Neighbourhood Team, said: "We were able to arrest Peyton and put him before the courts with a wealth of video evidence of him carrying out the bike thefts.

"We hope this sentence serves as a warning to other bike thieves operating in the city that these crimes are taken seriously and they too could find themselves in prison."

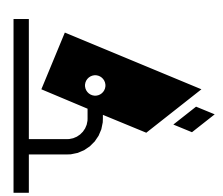

I am a Kent Police officer and currently work on the missing persons team at Margate Police station. Over the past week my team have been seeking a missing person Rob FOX who had left an address near Margate, and not been seen since.

Through the course of the investigation it was identified that Mr FOX was in the St Ives area.

Today I have had the pleasure of being able to work alongside Lynsey MITCHELL who was the duty CCTV operator. Along with the assistance of some other local businesses Mr FOX was sighted and followed by Lynsey. At the same time I was trying to contact Cambridgeshire police but was unable to. Lynsey tenaciously monitored the St Ives cameras, and used her police radio to contact police acting as the conduit for information between Kent and Cambridgeshire. With the assistance of Lynsey, Mr FOX was sighted and subsequently stopped by police officers, ending a week long investigation.

All too often people are quick to criticise emergency services or local authorities for a lack of action, and accordingly I wanted to highlight the excellent work that has been done today and indeed earlier in the week with CCTV reviews and downloads.

Lynsey has played a pivotal part in this missing investigation and I wanted that to be noted and recognised.

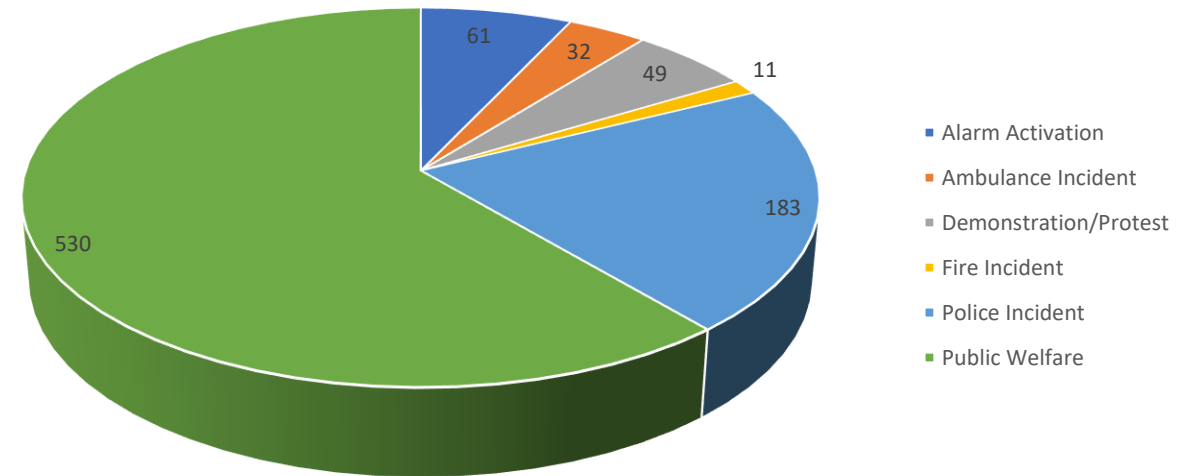
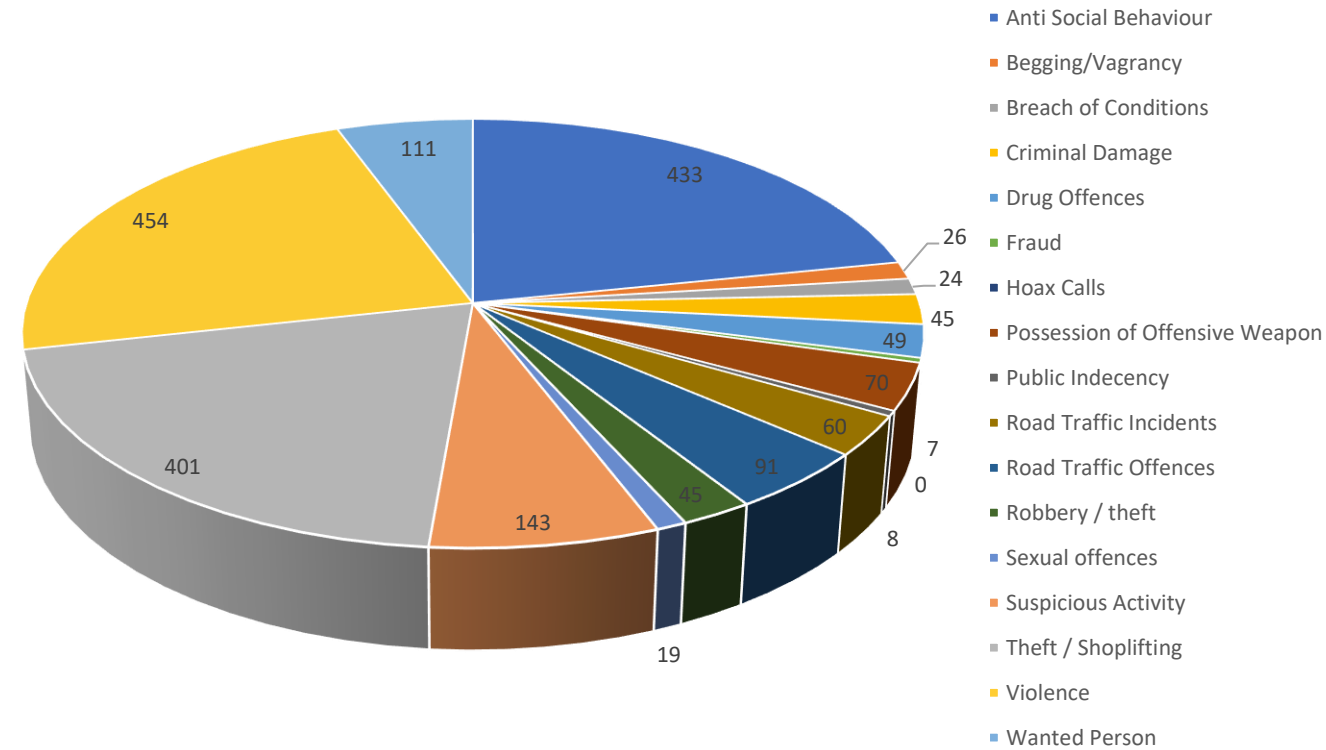


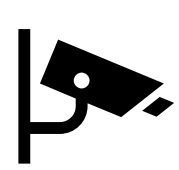
# TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – CAMBS CITY APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024

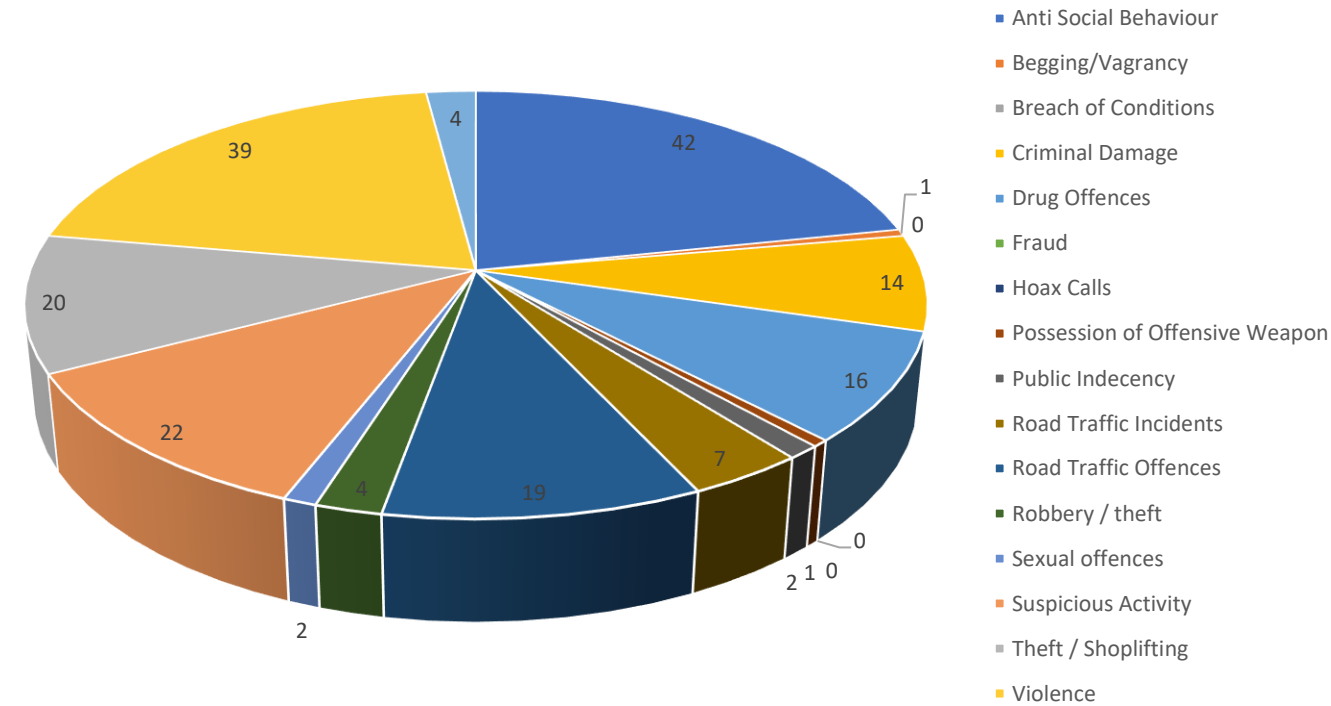




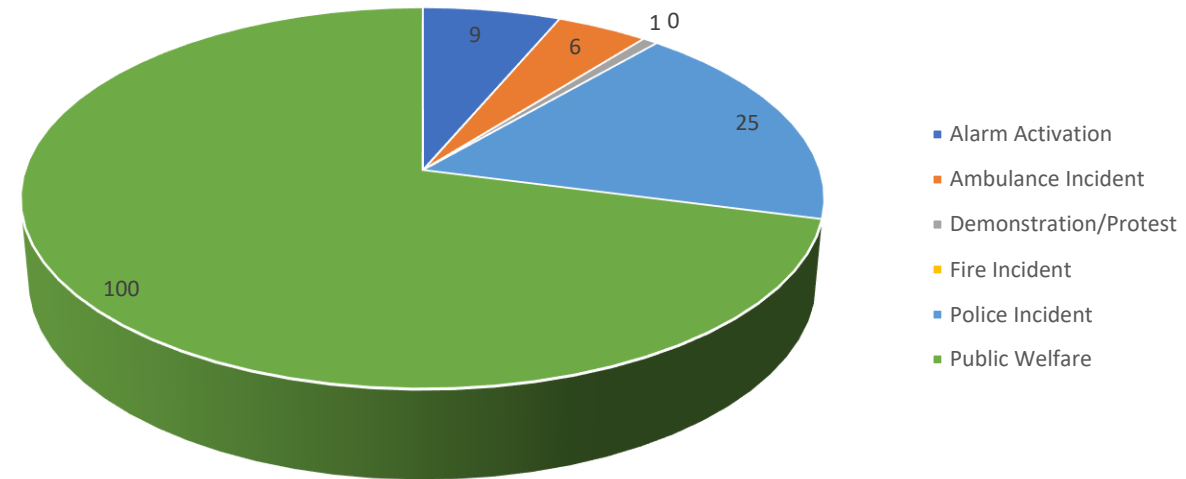
# TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST NEOTS APRIL 2023 – MARCH 2024

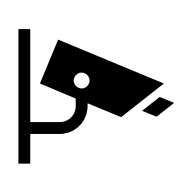


### CRIME incidents - St Neots April 2023 - March 2024

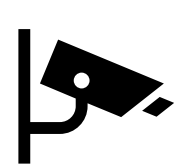

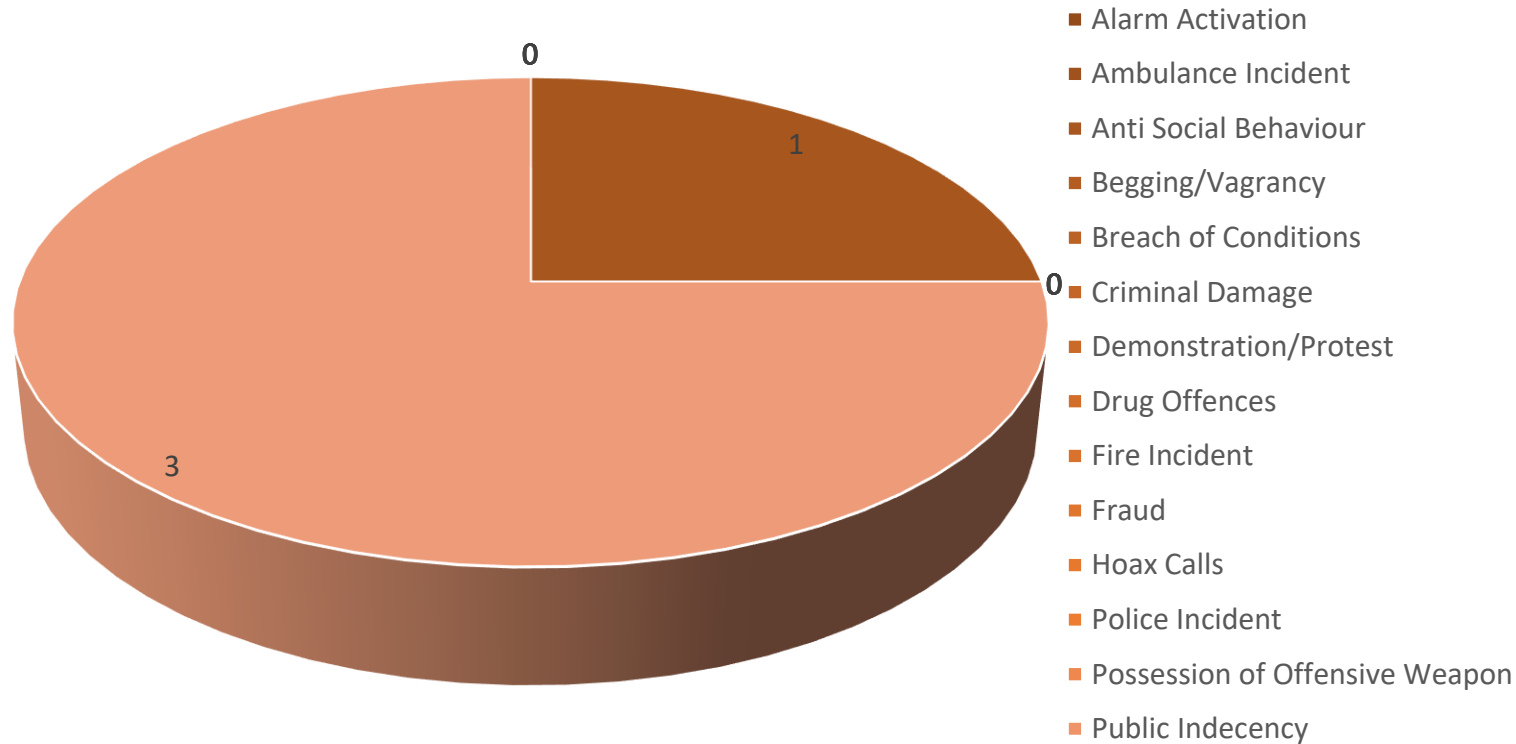




# TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – GODMANCHESTER & YAXLEY OCTOBER 2023 – DECEMBER 2023

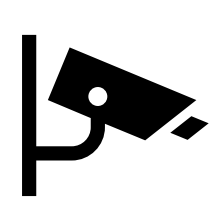

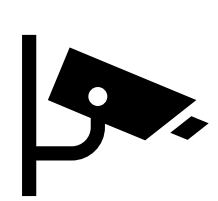


# CCTV CAMERA MAP – CAMBRIDGE CITY AS OF MARCH 2024

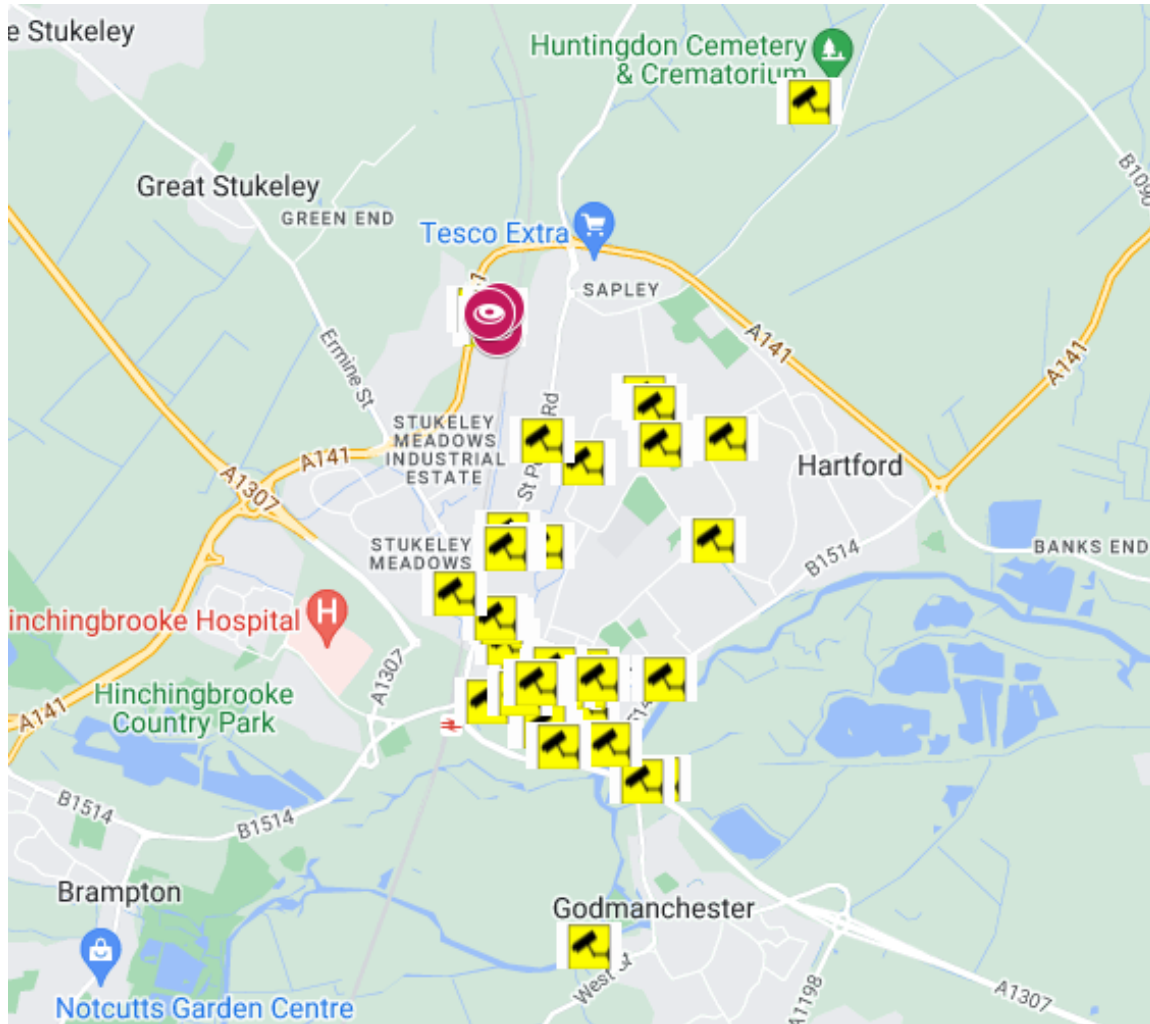

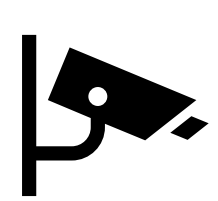


# CCTV CAMERA MAP – HUNTINGDON & GODMANCHESTER AS OF MARCH 2024

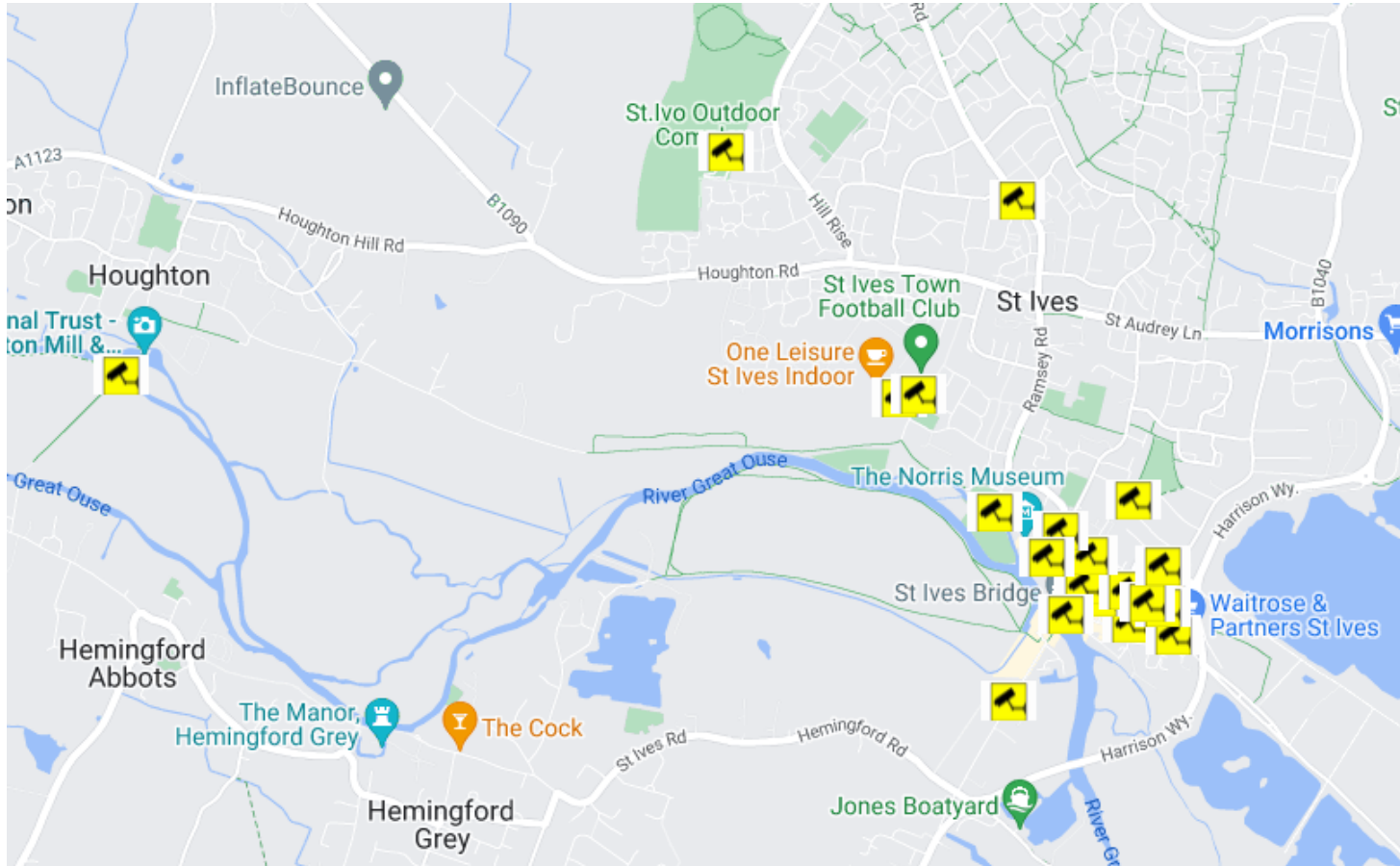

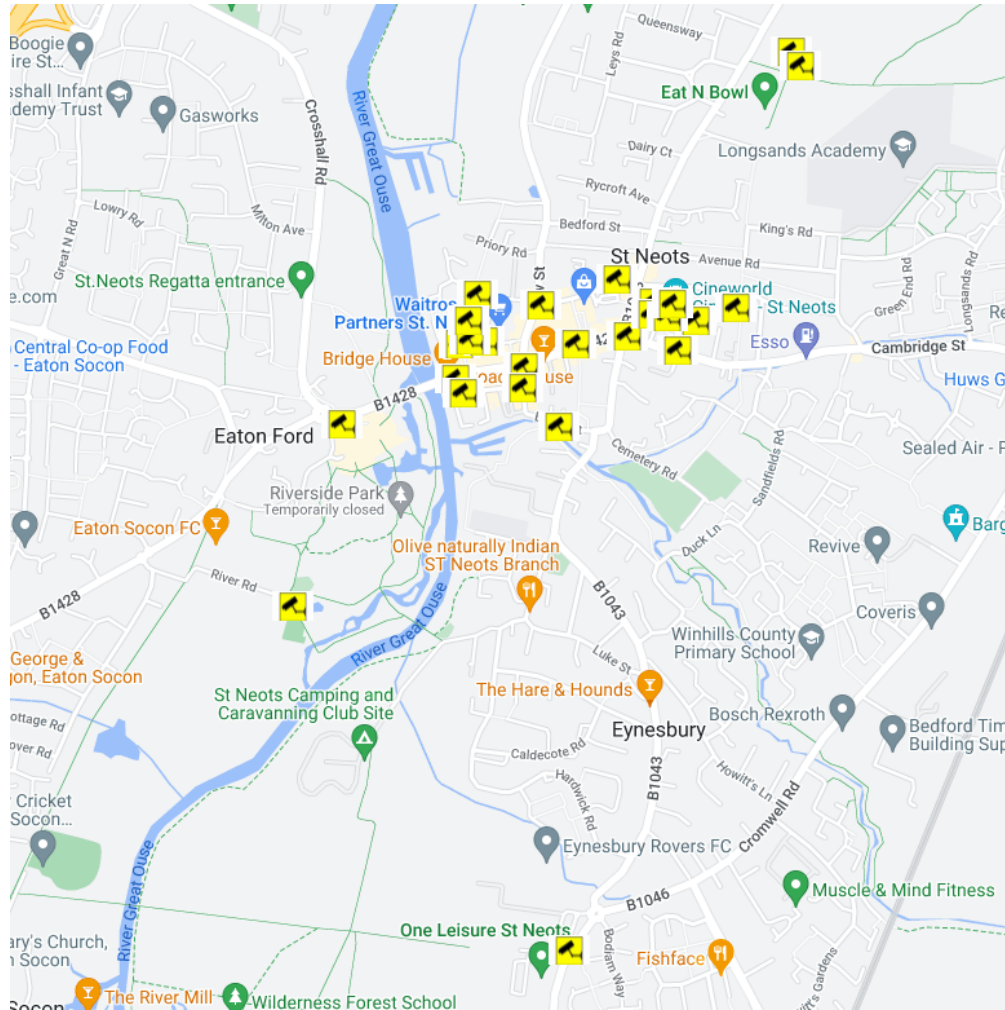

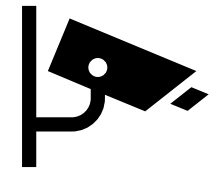


# CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST NEOTS AS OF MARCH 2024

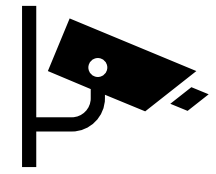


# CCTV CAMERA MAP – RAMSEY AS OF MARCH 2024

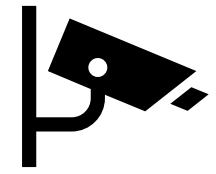


# CCTV CAMERA MAP – YAXLEY AS OF MARCH 2024
