# TOPLINE SERVICE PERFORMANCE







This chart shows the total number of CCTV incidents split by HDC and Cambridge City Council. As you can see, there are consistently more incidents per month within Cambridge City. These are broken down into Crime and Non-crime incidents over the next 3 slides.

The table to the right shows you the difference in incident numbers recorded in the same period, going back to 'pre-pandemic' 2019.








This chart shows the number of pro-active incidents by month. These are incidents where CCTV operators have used their observation skills and training to spot incidents that may have otherwise been missed.








This chart shows the total number of arrests logged on the VTAS system and also the number of those arrests that were linked to pro-active incidents.








The chart above shows the number of incidents directly linked to the CAMBAC and HBAC radios.

Q2 TOTAL CCTV EVIDENCE REQUEST & DOWNLOADS






This chart shows the number of evidence requests and downloads over the last quarter. As you can see there is a significant difference in number of requests to number of downloads, in particular September saw 95 requests but only 23 were actually downloaded.

There was a significant increase in 'Out of Hours' calls during September, especially when compared to the lower number of calls recorded in August. In particular, there were 75 calls linked to plumbing issues taken in September, this is compared to an average of 50 calls.



### TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES (APRIL '22 TO DATE)



# CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results and we would like to share a number of highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.



## REACTIVE ARRESTS – ASSAULT - HUNTINGDON



Incident 11091 – 2<sup>nd</sup> July 2022 – MP, AW, AS

#### **MULTIPLE ARRESTS FOR ASSAULT**

Operators spotted a group of males in the town centre who were arguing with another male, cameras were deployed and observations were maintained. A fight breaks out and police are informed, they have been watching the group on the 'live' police feed and immediately dispatch officers to the scene.

The fight escalates and a female joins the group, there is a lot of punching and kicking, mostly directed at one of the males in particular. He appears to be held in a headlock and is punched and kicked by the others.

Police officers arrive and break up the fight. 5 members of the group are arrested and taken into custody.

### PRO ACTIVE INCIDENT – CONCERN FOR PERSON – CAMBRIDGE

Incident 11140 – 5<sup>th</sup> July 2022 – EFF, LM, MC



### **UNCONSCIOUS MALE SPOTTED ON ROOFTOP**

Operators spotted a male who appeared to be unconscious on the roof of a city centre multi-storey car park, they immediately informed police via airwaves.

Police ask operators to review playback and find out when the male arrived, footage shows him walking up the roof before slumping against the wall, an ambulance is called.

Paramedics and police arrive on scene and administer first aid, he appears to have overdosed on drugs and is know to police. He regains consciousness and leaves the scene on foot, refusing to speak with police or paramedics.





Incident 11443 – 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2022 – RL, AS, LM

#### **MISSING CHILD FOUND**

Operators received a call and email regarding a missing child thought to be in the Huntingdon area, her description is given and the operators deploy cameras and search the area.

Later that evening operators spot a female matching the missing child's description, they maintain observations and inform police who dispatch officers to the location.

After initially denying her identity, the female admits that she is the missing child they have been looking for. She is returned to her home safely.





Incident 11877 – 16th August 2022 – PM, CJ

#### **DRUNK DRIVING PREVENTED**

Operators spotted a male leaving a town centre restaurant who appeared to be very intoxicated, he was seen getting into the driving seat of a parked vehicle. Details were passed to police via airwaves and cameras were used to observe the male who was sitting in the car.

Police arrived soon after, they arrested the male and also reported significant damage to the car. Operators used playback to review footage of the area, the car was seen reversing into a gate and causing damage, this information was passed to police.

This proactive work by CCTV operators prevented a potentially very dangerous drink driving incident.



Incident 11941 – 20th August 2022 – MP, AW, CJ



### **ARRESTS MADE AFTER FIGHT BREAKS OUT**

Operators observed 2 males leaving a city centre night club, they appeared to be arguing with each other and being quite physical. The males were joined by a group of females and a third male who attempted to separate the arguing pair. All 3 males starting fighting with each other resulting in punches to the face and one male being knocked to the floor. Operators called police over the airwaves.

Night club door staff attempted to break up the fight but the males were seen arguing with other people in the vicinity and not calming down. 1 male is seen walking off but soon comes back to the scene, further punches are thrown before police arrive to separate the group.

Officers arrest 2 of the males and take them into custody.

## PRO ACTIVE ARREST – CRIMINAL DAMAGE - CAMBRIDGE

Incident 11999 – 24th August 2022 – GB, RL



#### MALE ARRESTED FOR CAUSING CRIMINAL DAMAGE

Operators spotted a male chasing a truck in the city centre. Observations were maintained as the male was acting in an erratic fashion and appeared to be intoxicated.

The male disappeared down an alleyway and then reappeared holding a long wooden pole. He jumped in front of a taxi and then went on to strike the windows of several nearby shops. Police were informed immediately and observations continued.

The male was seen walking around the market square with the pole, which he had broken into 2 pieces, he was becoming increasingly agitated and was seen to hit a parked car with the pole as he walked past it.

Officers arrived on scene and arrested the male, he was seen kicking and hitting the van as he was taken into custody.



Incident 12394 – 18<sup>th</sup> September 2022 – MP, PM

#### **DRUNK DRIVER ARRESTED**

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio from a city centre pub, advising that an intoxicated male has tried to leave the back of their property in his car and caused damage. The male attempted to drive away, hit a wall and got his car stuck. Cameras are deployed and police informed. Operators are asked to maintain observations as there are no officers available at the time.

The male manages to free his vehicle and then drives around the city centre, appearing to drive very unsteadily. Police are kept updated of his location. He stops and gets out of his vehicle, walks around for a while and then returns to the vehicle and drives off. Operators are watching him throughout and keeping police informed. Officers are eventually dispatched and catch up with him, they stop his vehicle and carry out a breathalyser test on scene. The male fails the test and is arrested for drink driving.



## REACTIVE ARRESTS – CRIMINAL DAMAGE - CAMBRIDGE

Incident 12392 – 23<sup>rd</sup> September – PM, MP



#### ARRESTS FOR CRIMINAL DAMAGE, ASSAULT AND VERBAL ABUSE

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio from a city centre night club. They reported a very intoxicated and agitated male who was leaving their premises, cameras were deployed and the male in question was spotted leaving.

The male was seen kicking the window of a nearby shop and smashing the glass, police were informed over the airwaves and a team of officers were dispatched. The male was observed walking around the city centre, picking fights with other people he passed and then being joined by a group of females.

Officers arrived and the male was arrested at the scene. Also arrested were a female member of the group following a complaint received by police that she had been involved in a fight, and a further male who was abusive to the officers at the scene.


### MALE ARRESTED FOR POSSESION OF DRUGS

Operators observe a group of people openly taking drugs in the city centre, some appear to be chopping and snorting cocaine and others look like they are rolling and smoking cannabis.

Police are informed over the airwaves and observations are maintained. Officers soon arrive on scene, a male from the group runs off and the others are grabbed by officers as they also attempt to flee the scene. As one male is being searched the others manage to break free and all run off in different directions. The male who is detained is found to be in possession of drugs and a knife, he is arrested and taken into custody.



Great work!!!




Q2 TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – CAMBS CITY






### Q2 TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – HUNTINGDON






## Q2 TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST NEOTS














Huntingdon Cameras – 198 cameras (including cameras located at Huntingdon Crematorium and Godmanchester)








