


TOPLINE SERVICE PERFORMANCE



TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023











TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALLS RECEIVED JANUARY 2023 – JUNE 2023







TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023








TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC JANUARY 2023 – JUNE 2023










The chart above shows the number of incidents directly linked to the CAMBAC and HBAC radios. The dark red line shows the total percentage of all incidents recorded.

CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results and we would like to share a number of highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.







RE-ACTIVE ARREST — SHOPLIFTING — CAMBRIDGE

CAMBRIDGE CITY COUNCIL

Incident 17835–11th April 2023 – AW, RL

KNOWN THIEF ARRESTED

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, a city centre retailer was reporting a suspect who had attempted to shoplift from their premises. His description was taken and cameras were deployed.

The suspect was soon spotted walking away from the shops, he briefly went off camera. When he reappeared he had changed his clothing and was then heading back towards the shops, cameras were used to track him again. He is seen entering a building close to the market square, when he comes out he has changed his clothes again. Police advise the operators of the incident number and deploy officers, it seems that the male was already wanted for 4 other thefts.

Police arrive at the suspects location, he runs from them and officers chase. Operators help police by updating them of his location until he is finally surrounded and gives up. He is arrested and taken away.



PRO-ACTIVE ARREST – ROBBERY – HUNTINGDON



Incident 17970 – 18th April 2023 – RS, MH

TOWN CENTRE ROBBERY CAUGHT ON CAMERA

Operators spotted a robbery taking place in the town centre, it appeared to be 3 males trying to rob another male. Cameras were deployed and police were informed over the airwaves, officers were on route.

One of the suspects is seen punching the victim, who is wearing a school uniform. Thankfully, officers arrived on scene and immediately arrested 2 of the suspects, unfortunately the third suspect managed to evade officers and left the scene on his bicycle. Cameras were used to track the third suspect across the town, officers were directed to his location and he was eventually found and arrested.



PRO-ACTIVE INCIDENT – ASSAULT – CAMBRIDGE

Incident 18096 – 26th April 2023 – LT, PM



CONCERN FOR PERSON AND ASSAULT CAUGHT ON CAMERA

Whilst carrying out routine camera patrols, operators spotted a male laying on the floor in the city centre. Playback of camera footage showed that the male had been struck in the face by another male who was seen leaving the location in a taxi.

Police were made aware of the incident via the radio, operators asked door staff at a near by night club to check that the male was ok and call for an ambulance if necessary. The staff checked on him, they advised the male had been turned away from their premises earlier that evening as he was believed to be in possession of a knife. Police were informed of this and an officer soon arrived at the scene. He was searched but no knife was found. He later refused any medical treatment and left the scene, footage of the assault was later downloaded and given to police officers.



RE-ACTIVE ARREST – CRIMINAL DAMAGE – CAMBRIDGE

CAMBRIDGE CITY COUNCIL

Incident 18245 – 4th May 2023 – MO, RS

CRIMINAL DAMAGE WITNESSED IN CITY CENTRE

Operators spotted 3 very intoxicated males who were aggressively damaging a locked bicycle in the city centre. Descriptions were taken and their details were given to police, they badly damaged the bike and went on to cause criminal damage to council property including pulling bins apart and throwing rubbish around the streets.

Observations were maintained until police were able to attend, the 3 suspects were quickly found and arrested for criminal damage.



RE-ACTIVE ARREST – WANTED – CAMBRIDGE

WANTED MALE SPOTTED IN CITY CENTRE

CCTV staff received an email from Cambs police, with the images of 2 wanted people.

Later that day one of wanted people, a male wanted for 5 different offenses, was spotted riding a bike through the city centre. Police were called over the airwaves and his identity was confirmed. Observations were maintained, they observed the male stealing a bike and trying to conceal it in a near-by car park.

Police arrived and after a short chase the male was apprehended and arrested.


ARREST FOR POSESSION OF KITCHEN KNIFE

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, it was a city centre night club reporting 2 males waving long kitchen knives around. Cameras were deployed and police were informed of their location.

The 2 males were seen getting on bikes and riding away from the location, the details were passed to police and observations were maintained. Police arrived and managed to arrest one the of suspects, unfortunately the second male managed to ride away on his bike. After a short chase, the second male was caught by police and arrested.

Aggressive beggar who approached women and children is jailed after breaching order 20 times

An aggressive beggar in Cambridge who was given a chance to mend his ways has been jailed after he continued to break the law.

Jason Allum, 36, of Edgecombe, King's Hedges, Cambridge, was given a 28-day suspended sentence by Peterborough Magistrates' Court on March 13 for breaching an interim criminal behaviour order (CBO). But within hours, Allum was seen begging in the city centre.

The CBO, forbidding him from begging in Cambridge city centre, had been imposed on March 2.

He breached the CBO 20 times between March 13 and 31 by asking people for money, including placing his hands on people, approaching women and children and shouting and swearing.

He also begged inside The Grafton centre and Grand Arcade, where he approached customers sitting in a coffee shop, while shouting and swearing.

Customers and staff at the Burleigh Arms pub, in Newmarket Road, were also intimidated by Allum's aggressive begging numerous times. He shouted and swore at them when they did not give him money.

Allum was also spotted on CCTV going to an ATM with a woman who then gave him money, and then walking behind a lone woman.

On Tuesday, April 4, at Cambridge Magistrates' Court, Allum, of Edgecombe, King's Hedges, Cambridge, was sentenced to seven months in prison, having pleaded guilty to 20 breaches of an interim CBO.

PC Laura O'Flynn said: "Jason Allum has caused significant issues for a great number of people across the city and we worked really hard with the Crown Prosecution Service to get this CBO.

"We recognise the harm his behaviour has on the community, in particularly women and girls' sense of safety.

Bike thief jailed

A Cambridge bike thief has been jailed for six months.

James Peyton, of no fixed address, was handed the sentence at Cambridge Magistrate's Court yesterday (16 May).

The 29-year-old admitted stealing five bikes and one e-scooter between 12 December last year (2022) and 21 March from Grand Arcade cycle park, St Andrews Street and Cambridge Station Cycle Park.

He also admitted one count of theft by finding. A further seven offences of bike theft were taken into consideration by the magistrate upon sentencing after being admitted by Peyton. PC Rob Tindall, from the Cambridge City Neighbourhood Team, said: "We were able to arrest Peyton and put him before the courts with a wealth of video evidence of him carrying out the bike thefts.

"We hope this sentence serves as a warning to other bike thieves operating in the city that these crimes are taken seriously and they too could find themselves in prison."

Thief who stole designer clothes and perfume jailed



A thief who stole designer clothes and perfume worth more than £1,500 has been jailed.

Shaun Burrows was seen on CCTV stealing three jackets, perfume and a coffee maker from John Lewis, in Cambridge, worth £1,592 between 6 December and 26 February (2023).

The 45-year-old, of Victoria Road, Cambridge, was also arrested on 1 March 2022 and was found in possession of a knuckle duster.

At Peterborough Crown Court on Thursday (13 April), Burrows was sentenced to one year and seven months in prison after pleading guilty to five counts of theft and possession of an offensive weapon.

PC Wadsworth, who investigated, said: "Burrows is a prolific thief who has been targeting businesses in the city, stealing high value items, to sell on to buy drugs. We hope this time in prison will give Burrows the opportunity to get the help he needs to stop offending."








TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – CAMBS CITY APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023











TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – HUNTINGDON APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023











TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST NEOTS APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023











TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST IVES APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023











TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – RAMSEY APRIL 2023 – JUNE 2023















CCTV CAMERA MAP – CAMBRIDGE CITY AS OF JUNE 2023





CCTV CAMERA MAP – HUNTINGDON AS OF JUNE 2023







CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST IVES AS OF JUNE 2023






St Ives Cameras – 110 cameras (including one leisure centres)



CCTV CAMERA MAP – ST NEOTS AS OF JUNE 2023






St Neots Cameras – 58 cameras



CCTV CAMERA MAP – RAMSEY AS OF JUNE 2023




