




TOPLINE SERVICE PERFORMANCE








This chart shows the total number of CCTV incidents split by HDC and Cambridge City Council. The team have logged a total of 1131 incidents between April and June '24, this is a decrease on the previous year's figure – 1374 incidents.



The table shows the quarterly figures compared to 2023. The number of downloads are continuing to grow due to the success of the DAMS system.



TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALLS RECEIVED APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024






- OOH call numbers have remained steady over the last quarter.
- A total of 784 calls were received between April and June 24.




OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024





TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024






The chart above shows the number of incidents directly linked to the CAMBAC and HBAC radios. The dark red line shows the total percentage of all incidents recorded.

CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results, we would like to share several highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.



PRO-ACTIVE INCIDENT – PUBLIC WELFARE – CAMBRIDGE

Incident 24044 – 10th April 2024 - PM



VULNERABLE MALE SPOTTED IN CITY CENTRE

Together with a city centre doorman, operators observed an elderly male who looked to be in very poor health. This information, along with the male's description and location, was relayed to police via the airwaves.

Officers were deployed and soon arrived on scene to check if the male was ok, they took him to hospital where he was found to be seriously ill and in need of medical care.

Compliments were received from police control for spotting him, they do not believe he would have survived much longer. This was a great outcome for the team and collaborative work carried out between CCTV and CAMBAC users in the city.



Incident 24236 – 19th April 2024 – RS, MO



COUPLE ARRESTED FOR DRINK DRIVING AND POSESSION OF DRUGS

Operators observed a male and female enter a car; the male appeared to be drinking alcohol. The vehicle details and location were relayed to police over the airwaves, cameras were deployed to follow the car as it drove away.

The car was driven in the wrong direction along the Highstreet, operators also believe they observed the female passenger snorting drugs from the armrest of the vehicle. Observations were maintained as the couple travelled around the town in the vehicle, police were deployed.

The couple were stopped by police, asked to carry out breath-tests and arrested for being over the limit. After being searched they were also found to be in possession of drugs and driving without a licence or insurance. The vehicle was seized, and the couple taken into custody.



Incident 24849 – 22nd May 2024 – MO, RS



ATTEMPTED BIKE THEFT CAUGHT ON CAMERA

Operators spotted 2 suspicious males, cycling around the city centre looking very interested in the cycles which were locked up. Their descriptions were noted, and cameras were deployed to monitor their movements. After a short while, the suspects spotted an electric bike and came to a stop next to it. One of the males removed a large set of bolt croppers from his bag and attempted to remove the bike lock, police were made aware of the situation and officers were swiftly deployed.

After several failed attempts to cut the lock off the electric bike they cycled away but were soon spotted by officers arriving on the scene. The pair headed to Jesus Green where they tried to lose the officers, CCTV operators used cameras to monitor all park exits and the suspects were eventually apprehended. The male who had tried to cut the bike lock threw his bag into the river before being caught, he was arrested and taken into custody.

PRO-ACTIVE INCIDENT – MISSING PERSON – CAMBRIDGE

Incident 25027 – 1st June 2024 – PM, GB



VULNERABLE MISSING PERSON FOUND

CCTV staff received details of a missing person, a vulnerable young female. Observations were made throughout the day until eventually they spotted a female matching her description in a city centre park area. Police were informed and cameras were deployed to track her location.

Police eventually arrived on scene and confirmed that this was the missing female they were looking for, she was taken home.



Incident 25349 – 21st June 2024 – AS, KA, PM




THIEF APPREHENDED IN CITY CENTRE

A call was received via the CAMBAC radio, it was a taxi marshall reporting that a female had been robbed by another female, the description was taken, and police were advised of the incident.

Cameras were deployed and the area was searched, the offender was soon spotted walking across the city centre with a group of people. Their location was relayed to the police and observations were maintained until they arrived on scene. The female suspect became aggressive and was soon arrested and held in custody.

Drug dealer caught red handed on CCTV

A drug dealer caught red handed on CCTV in Huntingdon has been jailed.

Aidan Graves was captured by CCTV operators in Market Hill to sit on a bench and hand over white powder to another man in exchange for cash at around 3am on 9 May.

Staff monitoring the CCTV contacted police and he was stopped in the High Street where he was found with three bags of white powder and other drug paraphernalia.

At Cambridge Crown Court on Friday (21 June), Graves, 25, of Floras Road, Littlehampton, was sentenced to 16 weeks in prison after pleading guilty to being concerned in the supply of cocaine and activating a suspended sentence.

Detective Sergeant Josh Mills said: "We work closely with the CCTV Shared Service of Huntingdon District Council and Cambridge City Council to help tackle crime across the county.

"Drug dealing is not welcome in Huntingdonshire and those caught will be arrested and put before the courts."




TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – CAMBS CITY APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024





TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – HUNTINGDON APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024

















TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – GODMANCHESTER & YAXLEY APRIL 2024 – JUNE 2024

As of the end of June '24, there were a total of 812 operational CCTV cameras across both councils.



CCTV CAMERA MAP – CAMBRIDGE CITY AS OF JUNE 2024






