

## TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS BY COUNCIL JANUARY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023











## TOTAL OUT OF HOURS CALLS RECEIVED JANUARY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023






- OOH call numbers have remained steady over recent months, with a slight dip recorded in August.

## OUT OF HOURS CALL CATEGORIES JULY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023








## TOTAL CCTV INCIDENTS LINKED TO HBAC & CAMBAC JANUARY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023






The chart above shows the number of incidents directly linked to the CAMBAC and HBAC radios. The dark red line shows the total percentage of all incidents recorded.

# CCTV INCIDENT HIGHLIGHTS

- Our CCTV Operators regularly achieve fantastic results and we would like to share a number of highlights captured over the last quarter.
- The following incident write ups include a mx of crime and non-crime across both councils.
- We have experienced some excellent results; from pro-active arrests to tracking down some of our most vulnerable residents; saving lives and preventing crime from the control room.



# PRO-ACTIVE ARREST – THEFT - CAMBRIDGE

Incident 19269 – 1<sup>st</sup> July 2023 – MO



## **PICKPOCKET SPOTTED IN CITY CENTRE**

A male was spotted approaching a couple in the city centre, he was acting suspiciously. The male was seen hugging the victims, then taking a mobile phone from one of their pockets. He was then trying to open the other victims handbag.

The description and location of the suspect was given to the police over the radio, fortunately officers were nearby and were on scene within a few minutes. Operators observed the suspect moving between groups of people, trying to steal items from pockets and bags, when officers stopped and searched him they found the stolen phone and placed him under arrest.

## MALE WITH CONCEALED KNIFE ARRESTED

Operators received a call via the HBAC radio, the market manager suspected that a male in the town centre was in possession of a knife. A description was taken and cameras were deployed.

The suspect was spotted on camera and police were advised over the radio; observations were maintained as officers were on their way. The male was followed around the town centre, going in and out of shops. He then went off camera as he walked away from the centre.

A call was later received to state that the male had been picked up by police a short while after, it was confirmed that he was in possession of a knife which was recovered, he was then arrested.

A great team effort and a dangerous weapon seized by police as a result.

## SHOPLIFTERS ARRESTED

Operators received a call via the CAMBAC radio, reporting shoplifters that had just left a city centre shop with stolen goods. Their descriptions were taken, and cameras were deployed.

The suspects were quickly spotted on camera, their location was passed to police via the radio, observations were maintained. The suspects were becoming increasingly aggressive and eventually left the cameras view, police soon arrived, and the pair were arrested.

# REACTIVE INCIDENT – CONCERN FOR PERSON - HUNTINGDON

#### **Concern for child**

Operators received a call via the HBAC radio, concerns had been raised for a young child whose mother appeared to be highly intoxicated. A description was taken, and the cameras were deployed.

The pair were spotted in the town centre, operators confirmed that the mother did appear to be extremely intoxicated. Police were called and observations were maintained as the mother and daughter moved around the town. They were seen crossing a road, the mother not holding the child's hand and operators witnessed a near miss as the child ran out into the road and in front of a car.

Police arrived and took control of the situation, looking after the child and speaking to the mother, who was later arrested as her alcohol levels were confirmed to be very high.

## **ASSAULT OUTSIDE TOWN CENTRE PUB**

A call was received by police, requesting observations on a town centre pub where a fight had just taken place. Cameras were deployed and the operator could see a male on the floor, surrounded by people. Using playback of footage from the area the operator was able to see the incident take place and give the police an accurate description of the men involved, as well as their direction of travel after the fight.

The suspects were later arrested by police for GBH and ABH, using the footage obtained by the operator as evidence of what occurred.

# REACTIVE INCIDENT – MISSING PERSON – CAMBRIDGE

## **HIGH-RISK MISSING PERSON**

An email was received from police, advising of a high-risk missing person in the Cambridge area.

Using the description given in the email, operators used cameras to search for the male. A few hours later a male fitting the missing persons description was spotted by operators, police were updated, the male's location was tracked using cameras. Officers arrived and confirmed that this was the missing person, they escorted him safely away from the scene.

A great spot by the team!

#### WANTED MALE LOCATED

A call was received from police, asking operators to look out for a wanted male who they believed to be in the city centre.

Cameras were deployed and the male was spotted almost straight away, his location was given to police and observations were maintained. Police arrived and arrested the male for various theft offences.

# REACTIVE ARRESTS – WANTED PERSONS – HUNTINGDON

#### **2 X WANTED PEOPLE SPOTTED IN TOWN CENTRE**

Operators spotted 2 wanted people in the town centre, a call to police confirmed they were wanted, their location was given, officers were deployed.

Observations were maintained and police arrived on scene, they were both arrested and taken into custody.

# PRO-ACTIVE ARRESTS – DRUNK & DISORDERLY – CAMBRIDGE

#### **5 X ARRESTED FOR BEING DRUNK & DISORDERLY IN CITY CENTRE**


A group of 5 intoxicated males were spotted in the city centre, they were running and jumping around in the middle of a main road whilst drinking alcohol. Descriptions were taken and one of them was seen snorting a white substance off his keys. Operators used the CAMBAC radio to notify door staff nearby, at the same time the group were seen being turned away by door staff and shouting abuse.

As they moved across the city centre a fight broke out with a 6<sup>th</sup> male, door staff helped pull the male away from the group and they moved on. Police were called and asked to attend, their descriptions and location was given. Police arrive on scene and officers report no offences, observations were dropped.

Later that night a call was received from police, reporting a fight in the city centre and asking operators to move cameras. The fight was picked up on camera, it was the same 5 males from earlier, fighting the male who had been assisted by door staff earlier in the evening, they had him pinned to the floor against a bin. Operators used playback to confirm that these were the same males reported earlier, when this was relayed to police, they attempt to arrest all 5 males. 2 are arrested and 3 run from the scene, cameras are used to track their location and they are eventually caught by police and arrested.

# Policing Cambridge City Tuesday evening we got a call from CCTV operators in the city reporting a man attempting to steal a bike in Fitzroy Street. We caught up with him and he's since been charged with the attempted bike theft as well as possession of a knife in a public place and possession of drugs. Man went on bike tyre puncturing spree



A man who used a pair of scissors to puncture 42 bike tyres in quick succession in Cambridge has been sentenced.

Ife Bellow, 29, was spotted on council CCTV at about 2am on 18 October last year. Operators witnessed him stab bike tyres across the city, starting in Drummer Street and finishing in Guildhall Street and Guildhall Place where he was arrested.

CCTV operators had seen Bellow discard the scissors in a bin and they were recovered.

Bellow, of no fixed abode, later pleaded guilty to the 42 counts of attempted criminal damage, along with counts of criminal damage, assault, threatening behaviour, possessing an offensive weapon in a public place and theft from a shop, relating to other incidents.

He was handed a 12-month community order at Peterborough Crown Court last week (25 August).

PC Jack Burgess said: "To this day we still have no explanation for Bellow's reckless actions.

"He caused great inconvenience and expense to his victims and has showed himself to be a violent

criminal in other areas too. I am glad we were able to bring him before the courts."






Great to see all our efforts working in partnership to gather information, develop solutions, and deliver outcomes to successfully tackle cycle crime and restore confidence are finally paying off.


# TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST NEOTS JULY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023






TOTAL INCIDENTS BY CATEGORY – ST IVES JULY 2023 – SEPTEMBER 2023







There are 585 operational CCTV cameras across both councils, a large increase from last year now that Cambridge Park & Ride and One Leisure projects are completed.





# CCTV CAMERA MAP – HUNTINGDON AS OF SEPTEMBER 2023










